Coordinated Entry (CE)

How to Access Adult Homeless Services in Boulder County:

Are you a homeless adult (18 +) with no children in your household? Do you need a safe place to sleep, shelter, or help with basic needs? Your first step to receiving services from Boulder County or the cities of Boulder or Longmont is by contacting CE. This is a required step for anyone seeking homeless-related services. You will talk with a staff person and go through a short assessment. Based on that information, you will be referred to the most appropriate services given your needs. CE is available in both Boulder and Longmont. Services may include shelter; help identifying housing options, basic-needs services, Case Mgmnt &more.
